Established in 1995, the Prince Edward Point Bird Observatory is one of the most successful migration monito ring stations in Canada. Brian Joyce will take us behind the scenes of this research station situated on a Nation al Wildlife Area near Lake Ontario. Brian will explain how birds are captured, recorded and safely released. Le arn how this globally significant birding area attracts an abundance of song birds, butterflies and Sawwhet owls every year.

Brian is the Co-founder of the Prince Edward Point Bird Observatory who received his ecology degree from Carlton University.
